The Subcommittee of Building Officials will discuss on June 15 additional proposed amendments to the 2018 International Building Code. The primary discussion items will be proposals to amend Section 1615, Tsunami Loads, Section 1705.11.1, Complete Load Path and Uplift Ties, Appendix U of Section 423.1 related to Community Storm Shelters, and Appendix W of Hawaii Wind Design Provisions for New Construction.

Washington 7/3/2021 WSR 21-12-103

On June 2, the Washington SBCC filed a permanent rule in response to ESHB 1023 and addresses increasing beds for adult family homes. Chapter 51-50 WAC, Amendments to the 2018 International Building Code and International Existing Building Code. Effective July 3.

Washington 7/3/2021 WSR 21-12-102

On June 2, the Washington SBCC filed a permanent rule in response to ESHB 1023 and addresses increasing beds for adult family homes. Chapter 51-51 WAC, Amendments to the 2018 International Residential Code. Effective July 3.

Washington 5/28/2021 WSR 21-12-075

On May 28, the Washington SBCC filed a permanent rule to add an amended section to chapter 51-50 WAC; specifically addressing chapter 16, section 1615 on tsunami loads. The SBCC convened a technical advisory group to develop this amendment to provide a more accurate map reference to areas affected in Washington state. Effective June 28.

Washington 6/11/2021 TAG to Review Energy & Mechanical Proposals

On June 11, the Energy Code TAG will review proposals for editorial and clarification, for both mechanical and energy codes. Topics include low energy buildings, mass transfer deck, data center, HVAC, air intake, boiler efficiency, duct insulation, lighting, pipe length, roof retrofit, hydronic coil, hot water coil, boiler and pthp controls, thermostats, valves, and various others.

Connecticut 6/9/2021 Code Change Proposals

The Codes and Standards Committee discussed code change proposals from the public submission period, and heard 2021 CSBC and CSFC Code Review Work Group presentations.

Washington 6/2/2021 WSR 21-12-099

On June 2, the Washington SBCC filed a preproposal statement of inquiry regarding adopting and amending the 2021 International Wildland Urban Interface Code and moving the amendments from chapter 51-50 WAC to chapter 51-55 WAC.

Wisconsin 6/14/2021 Council to Discuss 2021 IECC-COmmercial

The Council will discuss and consider adoption of the 2021 IECC-Commercial Without Weakening Amendments. They will also discuss SPS suggested code changes related to administration and enforcement, building and structures, energy conservation, fuel gas appliances, and existing buildings.

Indiana 6/10/2021 Indiana Code Update Priorities

The Exploratory Committee for Code Updates published its priorities and the order of the code updates that it will recommend to the Fire Prevention and Building Safety Commission. The top priority is to update the Indiana Electrical Code to the most recent edition of the NFPA 70. The next priorities are to update the family of core codes to the most recent editions of the nation model codes (IBC, IFC, IFGC, IMC, IPC), and update the Indiana Energy Conservation Code to the most recent edition of either ANSI/ASHRAE 90.1 or the IECC. Low priorities are to update the Swimming Pool Code and Indiana Residential Code.

Washington 6/18/2021 Council to Discuss Code Proposals and Rulemaking Decisions

The State Building Code Council will discuss Group 1 Code Change Proposals and deliberations on rulemaking decisions. They will move to adopt 2018 IBC EV Charging.

The bill would require the Building Standards Commission to develop, adopt, and publish building standards that would require new construction of buildings, except for buildings regulated by the Office of Statewide Health Planning and Development or the Division of the State Architect, to be designed and built to a functional recovery standard, as defined, for earthquake loads. The bill would specify that if a functional recovery standard is not completed in time for inclusion in the building code with an effective date of January 1, 2026, engineered buildings, as defined, will be assigned to Risk Category IV, as defined in the building code.

On and after the effective date of the adoption of the 2020 Fire Safety Code, the code shall provide for reasonable safety from fire, smoke and panic therefrom, in all buildings and areas adjacent thereto constructed on and after January 1, 2006, except in private dwellings occupied by one or two families and upon all premises.
