		Chapter 160 - Power Generation Systems as Electrical	
Maine	10/4/2021	Installations adopted by the Secretary of State's Office	

The Secretary of State has adopted rule Chapter 160, Power Generation Systems as Electrical Installations; it is effective as of October 4, 2021 and has been made available on the SOS website.

The rule creates a new chapter that explains when installations of power generation systems are, and are not, considered "electrical installations" as that term is defined in statute. The adopted rule provides that a complete installation of a photovoltaic, fuel cell, or wind power generation system is an "electrical installation" as that term is defined by statute, and describes when installing portions of a photovoltaic power generation system that constitute less than a complete installation are not "electrical installations" as that term is defined by statute.

Maine 1/1/2022 <u>2021 UPC – Effective January 1, 20</u>

The Plumbers' Examining Board has adopted a rule repealing the current 02-395, Chapter 4, Installation Standards, replacing it with a rule with the same title and in the same location that adopts and establishes installation rules and incorporates by reference into board rule the International Association of Plumbing and Mechanical Officials 2021 Uniform Plumbing Code, Copyright © 2020, 29th edition, Third Printing, May 2021, as the standard for plumbing installations in the State of Maine, subject to the exclusions and amendments as set forth in the rule. The newly adopted Chapter 4 will be effective January 1, 2022.

On October 27, the Plumbing Code Advisory Committee will discuss plumbing code changes, including SPS 302 (Fee Schedule), SPS 381 (Definitions and Standards), SPS 392 (Design, Construction, Installation, Supervision, Maintenance, and Inspection of Plumbing), and SPS 384 (Plumbing Products).

The proposed amendments to the Rehabilitation Subcode became effective October 18, 2021. The proposed amendments addressed the sizing of

replacement mechanical equipment and the need for equipment guards for elevated surfaces within the fuel gas subcode.
