The bill requires the stretch energy code working group to establish the stretch energy code, which must have separate components for commercial and residential buildings and must establish minimum energy efficiency requirements that may exceed the requirements of the energy conservation code. The bill provides that any county, city, village, or town may by ordinance adopt the residential or commercial components of the stretch energy code, or both, and make the adopted requirements of the stretch energy code applicable within the county, city, village, or town.

The bill provides that the following amendments shall expire as provided in 2019, 250:4: I.RE-15-33-18, an amendment to International Residential Code (IRC) 2015, table N1102.1.2, relative to climate zone 6, wood frame wall r-value.

II. RE-15-37-18, an amendment to IRC 2015, section N1101.5, relative to information on construction documents.

III. RE-15-39-18, an amendment to IRC 2015, section N1102.1, relative to the building thermal envelope.

IV. RE-15-40-18, an amendment to IRC 2015, section N1102.4.1.2, relative to testing. V. RE-15-42-18, an amendment to IRC 2015, section N1103.6, relative to mechanical ventilation.

New Mexico | 12/14/2021 | Proposed | 2021 Sustainable Building Tax Credit

The 2021 Sustainable Building Tax Credit proposes to place the residential and commercial building rules into one rule, and provide the requirements and application process to obtain certificates of eligibility for the sustainable building tax credit from EMNRD for the construction in New Mexico of a sustainable building, the renovation of an existing building in New Mexico, or the permanent installation of manufactured housing that is a sustainable building or the installation of energy-conserving production to existing buildings in New Mexico.
