SCOPE

The Building Energy Codes and Standards (BECS) Committee represents the interests of the gas industry in the national codes and standards process of model codes groups, technical standards organizations, and federal agencies, to promote the continued use and marketability of natural gas downstream of the meter. Codes and standards have a significant impact on gas equipment installation costs, competition between gas and other energy sources and systems, and the introduction of new technologically advanced equipment. Reasonable and technically sound codes and standards are essential in promoting the safe and efficient utilization of gas equipment and accessories, and in paving the way for new gas technology that might otherwise meet with code-official resistance.

BECS ENERGY CONSERVATION ROSTER

SCOPE

Evaluates and provides comments on energy conservation codes and standards such as national model energy codes, federal minimum efficiency standards, and standards and handbooks on national consensus standards developers such as the American Society of Heating, Refrigerating and Air-Conditioning Engineers (ASHRAE). The Task Force also monitors activities of interest and representation on codes and standards committees that impact the gas industry with the objective of assuring industry participation.

BECS NEW TECHNOLOGY ROSTER

SCOPE

The New Technology Task Force (NTTF) examines new and developing pieces of gas and related equipment to determine how they conform with existing codes and standards or how codes and standards need to be modified to best accommodate new technology while maintaining a high level of public safety and confidence. The NTTF also monitors actions by the Federal Government and voluntary standards committees with respect to their effect on future equipment design requirements and the effects on the gas industry's competitiveness in the marketplace.

BECS INDOOR AIR QUALITY ROSTER

SCOPE

The purpose of the Indoor Air Quality Task Force is to monitor issues dealing with allowable indoor pollutant levels and their causes. The task force shall determine whether an established or new standard for indoor pollutants has an adverse effect on the marketability of any natural gas equipment or promotes an alternate fuel. The task force will respond to or seek to alter any standard that is deemed to be harmful to the gas industry.

The task force will also monitor and evaluate all existing and proposed ventilation standards and act in a similar manner if a potentially harmful standard is encountered.

BECS CODES & STANDARDS EDUCATION ROSTER

SCOPE

The information and its dissemination or flow shall be structured so as to facilitate its users in the application or use of natural gas.
