This bill creates the Rhode Island Inclusive Home Design Act. It provides that it is unlawful a person or entity, with respect to a covered dwelling unit for new construction or substantial rehabilitation by the person or entity, to fail to ensure that the dwelling unit contains no fewer than one level that complies with the Standards for Type C (Visitable) Units of the American National Standards Institute (commonly known as "ANSI") Standards for Accessible and Usable Buildings and Facilities (section 1005 of ICC ANSI A117.1-2009).

The bill directs the Department of General Services to establish and periodically update standards for State buildings to conserve energy and minimize adverse impacts on birds. It also requires the Maryland Green Building Council to include the standards in any requirements established for participation in a higher-performance building program in the State. Finally, it defines "State building" as one acquired, constructed, or renovated by the State or one for which 50% of the money for acquisition, construction, or renovation came from State funds.

The bill repeals the Tall Wood Buildings of Mass Timber Construction Incorporated as Part of the State Construction Code, adopts the 2021 edition of the International Fire Code, with amendments; and adopts and amends certain National Fire Protection Association codes and standards.

This bill directs the department of health to establish a refrigerant management program to reduce emissions of high global warming potential refrigerants and any refrigerant that is an ozone-depleting substance from the operation of stationary, commercial, and industrial refrigeration equipment responsible and adopt rules for the regulation of the use of such refrigerants. It also requires the state building code council to establish codes and standards consistent with the goal of reducing greenhouse gas emissions associated with hydrofluorocarbons when updating the state building code.

This bill would require the state electrical board to adopt rules requiring compliance, starting January 1, 2024, with the provisions of the model electric ready and solar ready code that require multifamily buildings to be electric vehicle (EV) capable and EV ready and to have EV supply equipment installed. The board cannot adopt rules that prevent the installation or use of EV charging stations except for safety concerns. The bill also broadens the prohibition on landlords unreasonably preventing the installation of EV charging equipment in leased premises to include assigned or deeded parking spaces, parking spaces accessible to tenants, and commercial rental property. Landlords are also required to allow EVs or plug-in hybrid vehicles to park on their premises. It also extends the prohibition on common interest communities unreasonably prohibiting the installation of EV charging equipment to include assigned or deeded parking spaces accessible to unit owners. Local governments must count parking spaces served by an EV charging station as at least one standard automobile parking space and any wheelchair-accessible van parking served by an EV charging station as at least two standard automobile parking spaces. Finally, the bill exempts EV charging systems from property tax until 2030.

It also adds that for a new residential building construction on or after July 1, 2023, the energy conservation standards in the 2018 International Energy Conservation Code published by the International Code Council are the state energy conservation standards.

This bill requires the state uniform fire prevention and building code the state energy conservation code be updated in accordance to changes in international fire codes. These codes include the International Building Code, the International Fire Code, the International Residential Code, the International Plumbing Code, the International Mechanical Code, the International Property Maintenance Code, and the National Electrical Code. It also stipulates that when an edition of a code is updated, the council shall, within twelve months of such publication, update the uniform fire prevention and building code to be updated to reflect such changes.

The bill would set a policy for state agencies to purchase or specify at least 10%, by volume, of cement and concrete, including supplementary cementitious materials by 2030 and to exclude the purchase of fossil-based supplementary cementitious materials by 2035. The bill would require, by March 31, 2024, the Transportation Agency, the Department of Transportation, the Department of General Services, the Department of Water Resources, and other state agencies, in collaboration with the State Air Resources Board, to develop and enter into advance procurement agreements for the purchase or specification of low-carbon cement and low-carbon concrete products up to 10 years in advance that would facilitate the development of production of concrete, cement, and supplementary cementitious materials that meet or exceed the benchmark for low-carbon cement and concrete.

This bill creates a new chapter titled "All Electric Building Act". The Act would require all new buildings to be built with electricity as the sole energy source, with the exception of restaurants, hospitals, medical facilities, and biolabs, if a permit application was submitted after December 31, 2024. Cities and towns would be prohibited from issuing a permit for the conversion of an all-electric building to a mixed-fuel building. The Act would take effect upon passage and the Public Utilities Commission, the Office of Housing and Community Development, and the State Building Code Commission must report jointly to the Governor, Senate President, and Speaker of the House.

The bill provides that for new non-residential construction, a local government shall adopt the state code for energy conservation in new building construction with any amendments it deems reasonably necessary to accommodate local conditions.

The bill creates the Buy Clean and Buy Fair Minnesota Act. The Act directs the commissioner of the Department of Administration to establish and publish a maximum acceptable global warming potential for each eligible material used in an eligible project. Specifically for concrete and structural steel by January 15, 2025. The maximum global warming potential must be consistent with the criteria in an environmental product declaration.

The Department of Administration and the Department of Transportation will require in a specification for bids for an eligible project that the global warming potential reported by a bidder in the environmental product declaration for any eligible material must not exceed the maximum acceptable global warming potential for that eligible material or product.

This bill modifies the energy code, adding that beginning in 2024, the commissioner will adopt each newly published edition of ASHRAE 90.1 or a more efficient standard, and amend it as necessary to achieve a minimum of eight percent energy efficiency with each edition, as measured against energy consumption by an average building in each applicable building sector in 2003. These amendments must achieve a net zero energy standard for new commercial buildings by 2038 and thereafter.
