This bill proposes an amendment to the state building code regarding the use of refrigerants. The amendment states that no provision in the state or local building codes should restrict or limit the use of refrigerants that are considered acceptable under the regulations specified in 42 U.S.C. section 7671k. However, any equipment utilizing such refrigerants must still comply with safety standards and usage conditions outlined in the designated regulations. If passed, this act will become effective 60 days after its approval.
