New Jersey	9/5/2023	New Jersey Uniform Construction Code Administrative Corrections

The Department of Community Affairs has issued corrections to the Uniform Construction Code (UCC) in N.J.A.C. 5:23-6, 11, and 12, effective from August 9, 2023. These corrections primarily involve updating references from the outdated accessibility model codes (ANSI A117.1) to the current title (ICC A117.1) for consistency throughout the UCC. Additionally, an administrative correction has been made in N.J.A.C. 5:23-11.4 to align with changes made in the 2021 model code updates, and another correction in N.J.A.C. 5:23-12.12 updates an obsolete year citation in a model code and references the building subcode. These corrections have been approved for administrative implementation by the Office of Administrative Law.

This bill would facilitate the conversion or redevelopment of commercial properties into housing, including adopting adaptive reuse\ordinances or other mechanisms that reduce barriers for these conversions to pro-housing local policies. The bill directs the Department of Housing and Community Development to convene a working group no later than December 31, 2024, to identify challenges to, and opportunities that help support, the creation and promotion of adaptive reuse residential projects. They will recommend amendments to state building standards and report their findings by December 31, 2025.

"This rule adopts NFPA code section Rule 870 Section 230.85. The code mandates that 1- and 2-family dwelling units must have an emergency disconnecting means installed. The disconnecting means should be easily accessible outdoors or within sight of the dwelling unit. It must also have a short-circuit current rating equal to or greater than the available fault current. If multiple disconnecting means are provided, they should be grouped together. Each disconnect must serve as a service disconnect.

It also adopts Rule 873. Sections 334.10 and 334.12(A) of the code mandating that type NM, NMC, and NMS cables are allowed for use in various settings, including one- and two-family dwellings with their garages and storage buildings, as well as multifamily dwellings with detached garages. In structures exceeding one floor above grade, these cables must be concealed within walls, floors, or ceilings providing a thermal barrier with a minimum 15-minute finish rating as specified in listings of fire-rated assemblies in accordance with the Michigan building code. Additionally, they can be used in cable trays within structures classified as types III, IV, or V, provided the cables are designated for such use."
