<b>North Carolina</b>	12/10/2024	<a href="#">NC Building Code Council to Review Amendments on Accessibility Standards and Fire Extinguisher Requirements for Specialized Buildings</a>
<p>The North Carolina Building Code Council's upcoming public hearing on December 10, 2024, will review two amendments. The first amendment would delete Section 1108.6.1.2 of the NC Building Code, which currently requires certain accessibility features for Type B units; the change clarifies that these requirements only apply to units occupied for over 30 days. The second amendment to the NC Building Code exempts single-story self-service dry boat storage facilities with locked units and no shared corridors from needing fire extinguishers at every unit, noting that such buildings have minimal occupant load and low escape risk.</p>		

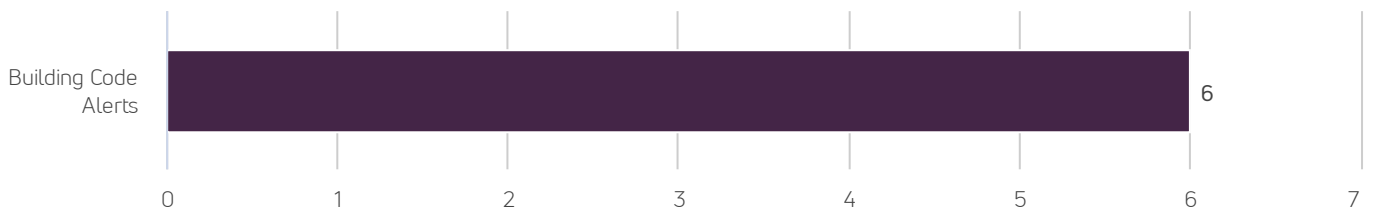

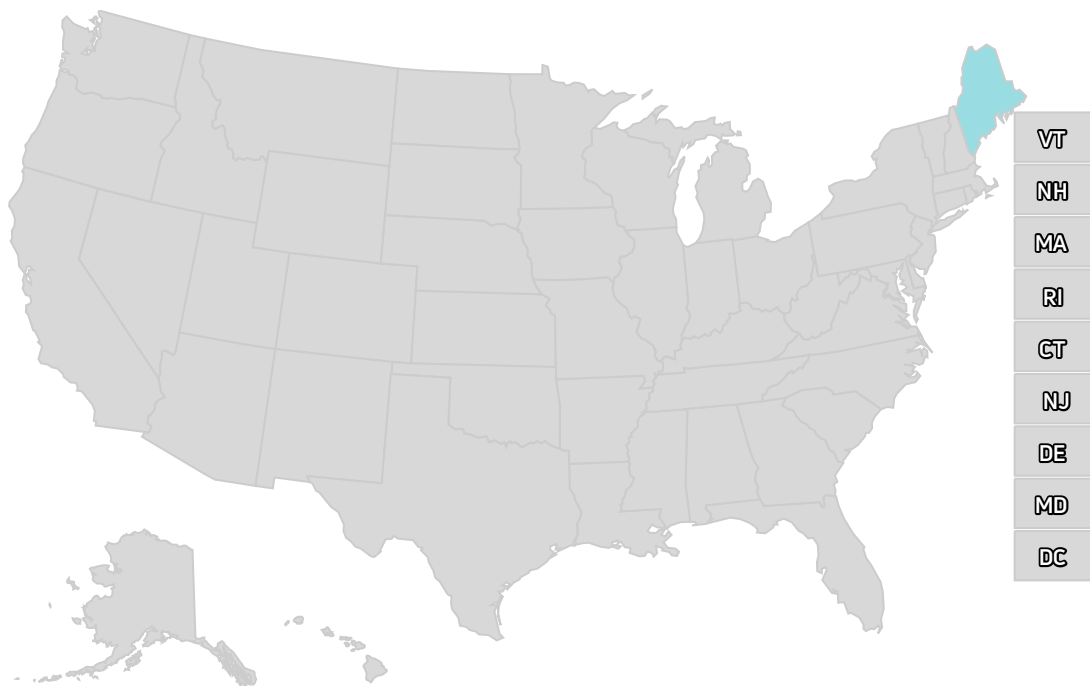
