



Title: Aquatic Facility (Public Pools) Administrative Rule Update To Align With Model Aquatic Health

Code (MAHC) **Tupe:** Proposed

Summary: This rule is s proposing to repeal Oregon Administrative Rules (OARs) in chapter 333, division 60, "Public Swimming Pools" and chapter 333, division 062, "Public Spa Pools," and adopt new rules in these divisions to reorganize and update rules relating to aquatic facility requirements. This rule aims to update rule language to better address the public health concerns with modern aquatic venues as well as to group sections of related topics together so the users can more easily find information based on their responsibilities at an aquatic venue, and to use inclusive and equity-focused language. The original rules were separated by facility type with pools separated from spas. However, with this rule update, the program proposes to reorganize to include all types of aquatic venues (ex; pools, spas, splash pads) and instead separate the rule sets by activity (construction provisions and operational provisions). This will allow both industry and regulators to utilize the rules more efficiently and include a wider variety of pool types. Most existing licensed aquatic venues will be able to continue to operate as licensed after the rule adoption, with the updated provisions of the MAHC applying to new construction only at this time.

Summary: This rule revises the energy provisions of the Oregon Structural Specialty Code (OSSC) from ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2019 to ANSI/ASHRAE/IES Standard 90.1-2022 with additional Oregon amendments in the 2025 Oregon Energy Efficiency Specialty Code (OEESC). The rule will provide a six-month phase-in period where either standard can be used.

Title: Establishment Of Oregon Building Energy Performance Standards Program

Summary: This rule adopts the ASHRAE 100 2024 national standards for energy efficiency in existing buildings for the state of Oregon, with Oregon-specific amendments as posted on the Oregon Department of Energy's website. Many changes will improve ease of use, such as improving clarity of language, adding a definition for "historic building," and including a note that a table listing

the expected useful life of certain equipment will be available for download on the ODOE Building Performance Standards webpage. The two most substantive changes include: (1) adding a requirement that a "qualified utility," in addition to having at least three percent of electricity or gas sales in Oregon, must also serve at least 50,000 customers (a "qualified utility" is a utility required under the rules in Division 330-300 to combine usage data from multiple utility accounts at the same building and provide the data to the qualified data recipient) and (2) adjusting the Energy Use Intensity targets for the restaurant sector to stay level over time rather than to become more stringent (the EUI targets for all other building types include a reduction of 1.7 percent per year).
